

# St. Benedict School & Cambridge City Schools

## Title I School-Family Compact

**School Responsibilities** - *StB staff & CCSD Title I staff will make every effort to follow current school, state, and federal COVID guidelines*

The StB School and CCSD Title I professional staff understand the importance of the school experience to every student, along with the responsibility of being an educator and role model. StB School staff and the CCSD Title I Teacher will:

1. Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that prepares and enables the participating children to meet the state's student academic achievement standards. The 2021-2022 learning environments may be different throughout the year in order to follow district, county, and state pandemic guidelines.
  - StB School and CCSD Title I professional staff will provide students with high-quality curriculum and instruction in a safe, supportive, and effective learning environment through the use of evidence-based strategies and differentiated instruction.
2. Hold parent-teacher conferences to discuss the individual student's achievement.
3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their child's progress.
  - Interim (progress reports) – midway through each quarter
  - Report cards – quarterly
  - Progress Book – online, anytime, parent access to student grades
  - Agenda Books
  - Notes or emails to parents
  - Virtual or face-to-face conferences
  - Phone calls
  - English language translations and interpretations for our ESL families on an as-needed basis
4. Provide parents reasonable access to professional staff for consultation.
  - Agenda notes
  - Class Dojo
  - Phone calls/messages – the StB School Office phone number is 740-432-6751
  - Virtual and face-to-face meetings as requested and scheduled, while following current school, county, and state pandemic guidelines
  - Class visits & observations if requested and scheduled, while following current school, county, and state pandemic guidelines
  - Email correspondence
  - When necessary, interpreters will be provided for our ESL families

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's classroom activities while following current school, county, and state pandemic guidelines.
  - Weekly StB School Newsletters – listing activities and StB School happenings for the week
  - Attend Leps Pride meetings
  - Chaperoning field trips, as scheduled and approved (pandemic restrictions may apply)
  - Special school events, as scheduled and approved (pandemic restrictions may apply)
  - Limited general classroom help (pandemic restrictions may apply), contact the school office

### **Parent Responsibilities**

As a parent, I understand that participation in my child's education will help his/her academic achievement and attitude. I will support my student's learning to the best of my ability in the following ways:

1. Do everything possible to provide a home environment that will encourage and stimulate learning –
  - Discuss what was learned at school each day because I understand how important it is to talk with my child.
  - Provide a quiet time and place for schoolwork and homework – away from distractions
  - Read to my child or encourage my child to read every day
  - Provide positive reinforcement for academic achievement
  - Communicate the importance of education and learning to my child
  - Respect the CCSD Title I Teacher and StB School building, staff, students, and families
  - Monitor my child's progress in school on a regular basis
2. Communicate regularly with my child's school, classroom teacher, and Title I Teacher –
  - Stay informed by promptly reading all notices sent home with my child or mailed from the school; communicate with the CCSD Title I Teacher and StB School by promptly responding to such notices, emails, Dojo, or phone calls when appropriate
  - Review homework, report cards, agenda books, emails, and other forms of school communication
  - Develop and maintain an open and positive relationship with my child's teachers
  - Participate in parent-teacher conferences
  - Attend school functions & activities on a regular basis as my schedule & pandemic restrictions allow
  - Volunteer at school as my schedule and pandemic restrictions allow
3. Remind my child of the importance of discipline, especially self-discipline –
  - Reinforce appropriate school behavior
  - Emphasize the importance of being well-prepared for school by having the necessary school supplies and completing remote learning and homework assignments on time
4. See to it that my child is in school or attending classes every day as long as he/she is healthy –
  - I understand the relationship between regular school attendance and successful academic performance
